THE STREETERVILLE STORY

Streeterville's story begins with George "Cap" Streeter, a boisterous con man who in 1886 ran his boat aground on a sandbar near present-day Superior Street. After a storm grounded his boat, Streeter decided to stay and declare the sandbar free from Illinois jurisdiction. He claimed this "District of Lake Michigan" as independent territory, inviting developers to dump debris, creating 186 acres of land. Streeter established a shantytown and sold land to unsuspecting buyers, leading to decades of legal disputes and armed standoffs with nearby wealthy landowners. After years of fraud and violence, the courts finally ruled against Streeter in 1918, asserting the land belonged to the developers and the city. The formerly lawless Streeterville area was rapidly developed, eventually becoming home to some of Chicago's most expensive real estate. Today, the district includes iconic landmarks including the John Hancock Center, Water Tower Place, and Navy Pier.

ABOUT MA STREETER

Ma Streeter – the “Empress of Streeterville” – was the rebellious wife of George “Cap” Streeter. As his partner in the 30-year land-grabbing fight, she was known for her feisty armed defense of their boat against police – even using a meat cleaver, boiling water, and a double barrel shotgun to fend off police during eviction attempts. After George Streeter’s passing, she remained on and defended the ill-gotten land until it was eventually taken by the city and cleared for development. Through it all, Ma Streeter earned her place in Chicago history books as one of the most tenacious and defiant land squatters in American lore.
